CRN would like to formally request access to the member's **restricted class**¹ for solicitations to CRN PAC. The restricted class can be defined broadly or narrowly, and CRN staff will be happy to discuss how you as an organization should define your restricted class (the executive contact, CEO and chief officers, all upper management or more broadly defined). This would define the individuals within your organization that CRN could solicit for the calendar year.

¹ Restricted class – those individuals within a corporation or labor organization who may be solicited for contributions to the organization's separate segregated fund (PAC) at any time and who may receive communications containing express advocacy from the organization.

You have the right to refuse to contribute without reprisal. Contribution guidelines are merely suggestions and CRN will not favor or disadvantage you based on whether you contribute or the amount of your contribution. Contributions to the CRN PAC are not tax deductible for federal income tax purposes. Only U.S. citizens and "green card" holders are permitted to contribute. An individual's contribution may not exceed \$5,000 per calendar year.
